Message from the Interim Moderator

Dear friends

As we enter the season of Advent we start to think about journeys because Advent is, first and foremost a journeying time of the Christian year with its destination being Christmas Day itself.

The thing about journeys, though, is that when we get to our destination, we often tend to forget about how we actually got there.

When we get off that plane or train at our holiday destination, we often lay to one side the fact of the journey that we've been through. My wife and I did that recently when we took the train for a short break in York. To be sure the journey was only two and a half hours. It was smooth, remarkably unremarkable. But leaving the station to begin the short walk to the hotel we were staying in, it was easy to see the journey we'd just been on as little more than a means to an end. It becomes something we just go through to get to where we want. The eye is always on where we want to go.

Advent is, of course, not like that at all. And, even if we treat them as such, I am not even sure that the journeys we go on to get to places are actually so easy to set to one side. After all the journey is part of the experience and Advent, to get back to the festive season, is the time of journeying that takes us to the birth of our Saviour which, itself, only came about after a journey to a little place called Bethlehem.

So, there is our own journey. And then there is the journey of our Saviour's family to where he was to be born. And now, as we approach Christmas, there comes the recognition that there has also been the divine journey too... the journey of God towards us.

Kirk Session News

It has been a busy time. The sale of our Manse on Hummel Road was completed at the end of October. There was considerable interest in the house and Ken Wright was extremely busy conducting viewings and arranging access for various parties to the Manse. We are all very grateful to him for this and the regular inspections he has carried out over the last year while the Manse has been unoccupied. The sales proceeds of just under £1.5m are held centrally by the Church of Scotland and are available to us should we wish to (and be allowed to) invest in new or existing properties.

The future of Ministry in Gullane and Aberlady was further explained to Kirk Session when we met with Lothian Presbytery in October. The plan is for us to move into a grouping with St Andrew Blackadder, North Berwick. We retain our separate Kirk Sessions and congregations and their Minister. Dougall, would Rev Neill be our moderator. In addition, we would have the services of a locum minister as we do now with Rev Fred Harrison. Our church building remains open and Sunday morning services will continue to be held there. On 2 December, members of Gullane, Aberlady and St Andrew Blackadder had an initial meeting to discuss how we may work together in future. This meeting was a very positive start to further discussions.

We are very much looking forward to welcoming people to our Christmas services this year. Unfortunately, COVID distancing restrictions mean that our churches have reduced capacity. We are not having our usual Watchnight service in Gullane Church on Christmas Eve. However details of all services, along with booking and streaming arrangements, appear in the Christmas Season listing opposite.

EJAM

Our new Evening JAM (also known as 'Eating' JAM) children's group has so far been hugely successful. We now have twenty children aged 8 – 11 who attend this group on a Sunday evening from 5:30 until 7pm. We have settled into a routine which seems to suit both the children and leaders well, with a Bible study and discussion focused around a chosen theme. Then the children break off to complete an activity in small groups before they enjoy pizza and other goodies from Gullane Superfry (this is the 'Eating' bit which the kids love!). The idea is to provide a friendly, relaxed environment to gain a basic understanding of what the Bible is for and how it works, as well as allowing the children to ask questions at their own pace, regardless of their previous knowledge. We also aim to make things relevant to the world around them and have fun

along the way. In November for example, the children showed a phenomenal understanding of COP26 and we read through Genesis 1 to understand how God wants us to look after the world. A huge thank you to all the kind volunteers who have offered to help us out for future sessions.
