

### From the Interim Moderator . . .

I remember a professor at New College once saying, "You need the Old Testament when the New Testament seems too good to be true!" Now, maybe he had his tongue in his cheek. But what he meant was this. The New Testament covers a short period of time when wonderful and dramatic things were happening. The Old Testament covers a long period of time, when there were long stretches between the big things – and I can't help thinking that this February magazine falls into such a stretch of time: Christmas is past, Easter is still a bit ahead, and for many people this year is stretching out into a tough and challenging time.

Well, the Old Testament gives us wisdom and resources to cope with the tough times – and in particular, the Old Testament has the Psalms. I spent a year writing poetry on all the Psalms, and I'd like to share with you the poem I wrote on Psalm 23:

# 23 Shepherd Sonnet

Contradictions, with a sudden dark to overtake our cosiness, our rosy hopes. The unexpected snakes devour the flimsy ladders that we pick and park for easy climbs to happiness. Who knows, we might today be falling, calling out for God to hear us, hold us, help us, fold us in those arms that felt the hammer blows to nails through ankles, wrists – such love to meet the cost of shepherding the likes of us; or finding courage in the cold of night, the daytime heat, the struggles of the street. You fill my cup with hope again: indeed I find, with you, I've everything I need.



### **Session News**

Since publication of the first edition of 'Connect' in November 2022 the Kirk Session has been kept busy with several developments. The purpose of this article is to bring members of the congregation up-to-date or more aware of the latest information.

The most popular question we are asked is, 'When will we get a new Minister?' Sadly, we are not much further forward at the time of writing. The new Presbytery of Lothian and Borders, which unites the former presbyteries of Duns, Jedburgh, Lothian and Melrose and Peebles, held its inaugural meeting at St John's and King's Park Church, Dalkeith, earlier this month. Although discussion of the Mission Plan was on the agenda, due to a last-minute request in December for a further review of the Plan we cannot yet take steps to call a Minister. The latest news we have is that the situation should be resolved by March and the Nominating Committee can then begin to advertise the vacancy.

With the prospect of a half-time Minister, and by way of preparation for a part-time appointment, two new initiatives have been launched. The first had its genesis in a promise which we set out in our Parish Profile that elders will help to lead worship. We have now set up a Worship Team with the aim that its members will lead services once a month. The first meeting of the team will be held in early February and Session has emphasised that members of the congregation will also be able to join the team in due course. The second initiative, the introduction of joint services on the first Sunday of each month, will start on the first Sunday in March when the service will be held in Aberlady. All Joint services will start at 10.30am and alternate between the two churches each month. Both initiatives are ways in which we can support a part-time minister by offering relief and assistance with pastoral and worship duties.

Regular worshippers at Gullane will have observed that two pews have been removed at the rear of the church to create space for our new audio-visual equipment. Again, much of this development work is in support of ways in which we can best meet everyone's expectations associated with a part-time minister appointment. In addition to enhancing our usual Sunday morning services, we will also have the ability (if not the initial expertise!) to stream a service from another church. Over the next few weeks, training sessions are planned to increase the number who will be confident to use the technology at Sunday services.

Members of the Property Team have been kept busy at both Aberlady and Gullane dealing with problems associated with water ingress and blocked water inlets. Happily, these issues have now been addressed and normal service is resumed. Going forward, the Property Team is now progressing work currently in the pipeline at Gullane. This includes the replacement of pews and the church heating system, the upgrade of kitchen and toilet facilities in the Church Centre and the secondary glazing of draughty south facing windows. Work at Aberlady is also to be taken forward and this will include the painting of the exterior of the church and repairs to the boundary wall at Kirk Stables. A Presbytery Inspection will provide expert opinion on the overall condition of the church building at Aberlady, but we require to wait until such times as one is scheduled by Presbytery.

Session congratulated the JAM and EJAM team on its success over the past year. Nearly 40 children participated in the Nativity Service and an enormous amount of work was invested in its success. Well done to all involved.

Finally, Session has agreed that Communion dates will remain as at present and take place on the last Sunday in February, May, August and November of each year.

# **Church Finances - Treasurer's update**

The Church financial year runs from January to December. I am working on the 2022 accounts and when completed they will be approved by the Kirk Session and the auditor. An Annual Stated meeting will hopefully be held later in the spring at which you will have the opportunity to have the accounts explained. This is an information meeting as members of the Kirk Session are responsible for their approval. 2022 has been a challenging year with the union of the two churches in August and the subsequent joining of the bank accounts and all the necessary changes. I am very grateful to everyone for their co-operation in changing their bank orders for their donations. Some essential work on our buildings was done and the Gullane Church roof had some repairs. At Gullane a new Audio-Visual system has been installed and is nearly completed. It is definitely a big improvement.

I am delighted to report that that we have a reasonable surplus.

I am grateful for your continued support in your giving through your offerings. Please continue to do so. You can do so by cheque or by Standing Order via the bank. For further information, please speak to Morag Black at Gullane or to me at church, or by phone.

I am pleased that we can now take donations in the plate at the rear of the churches, either Free Will or open plate. This is helping to improve our regular income. Just as we are all experiencing rising costs at home, it is the same for the church. The heating costs are very high during winter.

### **East Lothian Foodbank**



2022 was a record year for the Foodbank in East Lothian. Sadly, it's not a record we are proud of as we saw demand rise by 51% from 2021, with emergency food sent out to 4,702 households, supporting 11,373 people including 4,286 children.

With the current cost of living crisis, December also saw record numbers of referrals. From 1st-23rd December 495 households received emergency food parcels, feeding 1257 people, of whom 429 were children. 661 Jingle bags (providing an additional special meal at Christmas) were also distributed to 417 households. We also passed on more than 90 Jingle bags to partner agencies for their distribution.

East Lothian Foodbank as a charity has a Board of Trustees and paid staff but it is volunteers who receive and sort donations of food at the warehouse in Tranent, as well as pack and deliver food parcels and Jingle bags. New volunteers have signed up since COVID but more are always needed. At Christmas time we also get voluntary help from local companies wishing to help with the increase in donations and demand. Tesco collections supplement individual donations but keeping up with demand is always a challenge. Financial donations are greatly received and among other things used to top up food supplies where necessary. Such is the current demand at the Foodbank, the Board members are in conversation with the local council and private landlords regarding the possibility of relocating to bigger premises.

Drop off points for non-perishable foods/food items are, in Gullane, the CO-OP, the library and the Church vestibule (when open). In Aberlady food can be dropped off similarly in the church or Village Hall, when open.

Post Office hours are: Tuesday 13.00pm - 15.00pm / Friday 10.00am-12.00 noon.

Our **Christmas Craft afternoon** in Gullane went down well. Families enjoying the usual variety of crafts and activities on offer, followed by 'Christmassy' refreshments. We were delighted to welcome Andrew Duncan, the Youth Worker at St Andrew Blackadder, who was glad to come and meet our families and he led the short time we always have for a story. Thanks as always to the helpers who come to our craft sessions. Our next event will be the **Easter Craft Afternoon** which will be held in Aberlady Kirk Stables on March 26<sup>th</sup> from 3-5pm.

Looking ahead to Easter we plan to have another of our church walks on **Palm Sunday**, 2<sup>nd</sup> April, leaving as usual from Gullane Church at 2pm. JAM Club will also be hoping there will be the usual Easter Egg hunt during the service on **Easter Sunday** in Gullane. Plans are yet to be confirmed but look out on the website/Facebook for confirmation.

With the introduction of monthly joint services, alternating between Aberlady and Gullane, JAM Club will move with the service, therefore will be in Aberlady on March 5<sup>th</sup> at 10.30am and Gullane on April 2<sup>nd</sup> and so on.



Wow what an event! We had a waiting list for tickets and sold out within 10 days of advertising. Families from Wales and Ireland joined us. Babies to grannies & grandpas were all there dancing, singing, laughing, eating and sharing bringing in the New Year together. It was so good to be back.

As we move forward into 2023 we have a number of bookings in our events diary which is wonderful. We must give thanks to Gullane Community Association Trustees, as without their support we would not have achieved all that we have. They generously give us the use of the Village Hall on a Friday morning to practise, a wonderful space which enables us to meet together and play together. Thankyou!
